A Sense of Belonging

Our vertical Form Groups and House System are at the heart of school life at WGHS and enhance our outstanding pastoral care, enabling students to build relationships across year groups. The vertical Form Groups span from Year 7 to 13 and provides our older students with opportunities for leadership, mentoring advice as well as support between students of different ages.

Each of our 4 Houses are made up of Heads of House and Assistant Heads of House, Form Tutors, staff and students. We are committed to fostering a genuine sense of belonging for each individual at WGHS, with the House system serving as a fundamental component of the pastoral care offered in School.

Each year we have House Competitions including:

- Britannia - the House with the most house points on a termly basis wins the prestigious Britannia Trophy.
- House Arts - a student led event which offers our students the chance to write, choreograph, compose, direct and perform in a themed House performance.
- House Winter Games - there really is something for everyone at House Winter Games: Sports, 'Bake-Off', Public Speaking, Spelling Bees, Quizzes, Dissections. All are judged by a member of staff in a 1st-4th ranking with the overall highest points being crowned House Champions.
- Sports Day - the vibrancy of our school community is most evident at Sports Day. Our students adorn their House colours competing on the track, in the field or in the traditional welly wanging; camaraderie and determination are in abundance.

Trips, Tours and Expeditions

Life beyond the school gates fulfils dreams, providing excitement, perspective and broadening the intellectual horizons of our students. Year 7 Admissions

WGHS admits 180 students in Year 7. A place being offered at Girls' High is determined by performance in the Entrance Test. The Entrance Test measures ability in verbal reasoning, non-verbal reasoning and mathematics. The process starts in the Summer Term of Year 5 when parents can register their children for the Entrance Test. The Test then takes place in September of Year 6 with results released in October before the Local Authority Secondary School Preference List deadline. Places would then be offered in March the following year.

WGHS is part of the West Midlands Grammar School Consortium, made up of 19 Grammar schools across the West Midlands and Shropshire. The Test provider is GL Assessments and being part of the Consortium means that children only need to sit one Entrance Test across these 19 schools and providing parents give consent on the registration form, test results and data can be shared with all schools in the consortium.
